## Dear Siloam ministry investor

Although last year was extremely challenging for Siloam, as I am sure it was also for you, we were able to help our partner in Bulgaria, Pastor Darin Ivanov with a ministry gift of £10,000. This provided 1,150 food parcels for adults and 550 smaller gift packs of 'goodies' for the children we help in orphanages and those living in abject poverty.

The funds were provided to the area pastors living in Lom, Silistra, Dulovo, Bogdanzi, Tutrakan, Razgrad, Vidin as well as the main church at Rousse. The pastors then obtained the best prices they could from their local supermarkets and recruited volunteers from their churches to put the food parcels together. Because of the different prices in various locations, obviously the food parcels differed slightly in contents.

However, each parcel contained canned fish, **paté**, canned meat, rice, flour, spaghetti, sugar, salami sausage, macaroni and an important booklet entitled "God's word for everyday" to meet spiritual needs.

Altogether 26 churches in northeast Bulgaria received food parcels to distribute to their poor church members and those folk in the locality whose dire need was known to the churches. This meant that many hearts were softened and made more fertile for the gospel message of God's love and hope of salvation. The testimonies were very touching. One aged widower, who was bedridden, was visited by the pastor from Lom, started to cry and asked "who would think of me?" The pastor replied, "Jesus thinks of you." When the pastor told him the 'good news' about salvation and how he could receive eternal life, the man repented and accepted Christ into his heart.

Another young lady, also bedridden and suffers with epilepsy, received her food parcel, then raised her hands and started to thank God for His mercy and that someone had actually thought about her.

In the small village of Mihailovo, there were 4 children who live alone. The eldest sister is 14 years old and she came along to the church meeting with her brother of 16. He was actually 'tied' to her skirt. Two younger siblings were also in front of her, tied with ropes like horses. When the pastor asked the

young girl why they were in this condition, she answered that her elder brother is blind and the two younger brothers have mental problems.

This was a tremendous shock to the pastor to come to know about this family's tragedy, he promised to visit the home and provide clothing and food.

On another pastor's report, he mentioned that as he travelled with the food parcels in his car, he passed by a home and noticed a boy of 8 years of age cutting wood with a chainsaw! Two smaller children then took the logs and arranged them on the other side of the yard. The pastor stopped and asked the children if they had any parents. Their answer was only their father. The children were delighted to receive a Christmas food parcel, there were tears in their eyes.
