## Dear Siloam ministry investors and giving partners

Siloam has been providing funds for our co-workers in the developing world with which to conduct children's summer Bible camps since 1984. This first happened in Portugal where I had been visiting former colleagues after returning from my missionary area of responsibility in India. I was invited to attend a Campo Biblico children's Bible camp at Figuera Da Foz on Portugal's Atlantic coast. It was a wonderful occasion for me and I could see the tremendous benefit of taking a child away from his / her poor home situation and providing a holiday in a safe environment, away from negative influences so they could absorb in a simple and practical way, the Christian message of the gospel that provides the gift of eternal life.

Since those early days, Siloam has sponsored hundreds of camps in several countries, this year we are supporting camps in far less countries, as we are still suffering from the restrictions caused by 'Covid-19.'

have been helping PRR for a number of years not just with their Bible camp budget but also with their regular children's ministry supporting children in their two children's homes as well as many others in the outlying community. The recent refugee crisis in Ukraine has also brought an extra burden but also

many opportunities to show Christian love to desperate families fleeing their homeland at this very difficult time.

Back in 2020, Siloam supporters provided £5,000 to help 50 children aged between 6-14 from the villages of Siminoc and Tortomanu villages near Constanta in Romania. Because of the 'Covid-19' pandemic, the camp was delayed for a year!

Between 5th to 9th July, these children who don't normally receive any spiritual input at a local church, were invited to take part in 'a different week' where they could enjoy a time away from their poor home situations.

The children were taken to a hilly area in Brasov where it was cooler so that they could enjoy visiting a touristic area while lodging in the simple accommodation of a Pension (low-cost hotel) where the PRR staff and volunteers prepared all the meals and maintained the cleanliness of the property.

The theme of the week, 'a different week' was a very special one for the children as well as the 10 staff and 4 youth workers who organised the camp's activities. The children enjoyed a well trusted and tried out formula\_beginning with exercise activity first thing in the morning. Then, the children were split into 3 different groups so they could visit various activity stations where they would take part in brief Bible lessons, learn Christian songs, spend time learning memory verses of scripture and enjoying craft sessions and taking part in various physical games and competitions.

The children were especially encouraged to know that others overseas like you, had an interest in their well-being and had provided the funds for them to go to the theme parks like The Fargaras Castle, The Clay Castle, The Fairy Valley, The Calendar Park as well as The Animal Farm.

These children came to realise they had a 'self-worth' which was being emboldened because of those caring for them provided the emotional support they needed. The children
